

**Duties & Responsibilities:**

- (a) quality health care service;
- (b) constant up gradation of curative services in tune with the latest technologies and within the resources available to Railways.
- (c) provide regular C.M.E ( Continuing Medical Education) inputs to medical and paramedical staff
- (d) establish effective base for disease prevention and health promotion services including industrial health;
- (e) meet the administrative needs of the Indian Railways;
- (f) work for the acceptance of a small family norm by the staff;
- (g) ensure adequate physical standard of the employees at recruitment and during their periodical check up.
- (h) provide and maintain accident relief medical equipment, including first aid boxes, to give prompt relief to passengers injured in railway accidents;
- (i) attend the passengers injured or taken seriously ill in trains or at Railway stations, on payment, under certain circumstances;
- (j) provide medical facilities at par with serving employees to those retired Railway employees who have opted to become members of the RELHS '97; and
- (k) administer medical treatment to outsiders, on payment, under certain circumstances.
- (l). Indian Railways Health Services have adopted the modern system of medicine.

The Principal Chief Medical Director is the overall Administrative officer in Highest Administrative grade of N.F. Rly Zonal Railways of Medical department helped by CHD, AMCD/TA, ACMD/MS, Dy. CMD/HQ. MD is the overall in-charge of the Zonal Hospital with respective CSS, ACMD/Administration along with the other ACMSs, Sr. DMOs DMOs and ADMOs in different fields of their activity for curative, promotive and preventive aspects for the wellbeing of the employees and beneficiaries. Like wise in all the 5 divisional Hospitals and 3 sub-divisional Hospitals of N.F. Railway are having CMSs and Administrative officers who monitor the daily activities of the Medical department respectively.
